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A STUDY OF CONTEMPORARY FICTION IN INDIAN ENGLISH LITERATURE

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ABSTRACT

With a few exceptions, the vast majority of English literature has focused on the urban middle class. The English-language novels of Indian authors were influenced by the works of English authors. Modern Indian literature in regional languages has a heartfelt focus on rural people's social, political and economic realities, unlike those two works. In addition to being criticisms of the repressive ideas that tear at the fabric of daily life, many books aim to inform readers about social structures and traditions that have shaped society as a whole. There is a level of genuineness in the narratives that distinguish them from other genres. It is the goal of this research to investigate the link between history and fiction in the context of current Indian English novels.
